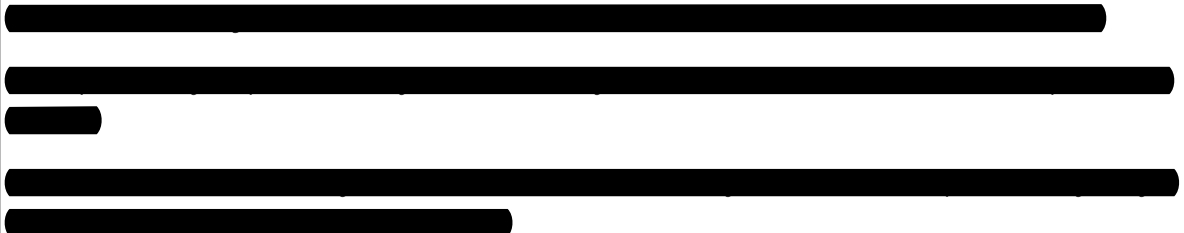
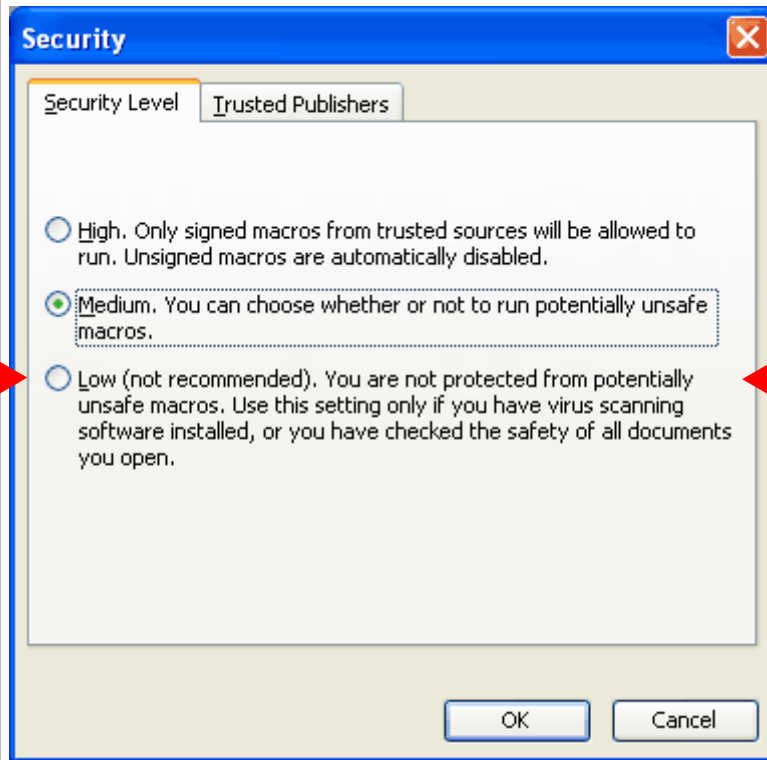
Problem

I've recently updated to Microsoft Office 2003, and now I cannot get the macros in my Access databases to work. How can I re-enable those macros?

Solution

Most likely, your problem is related to the fact that Microsoft Access 2003 runs in a very high security level. In order to get the functionality available in previous versions of Access, you need to lower the security level to allow you to run macros.

To do this, close all open applications, open **Access**, and go to **Tools -> Macro -> Security** to open the **Security** window.



If you do not want to be prompted each time a macro runs, you can set your Access Macro Security to **Low**, but you should not do this if you ever open Access databases created or modified by others.
